On Trinity Sunday we remember with solemnity and praise the foundation in which we live and worship throughout the year. We are invited to encounter God as Three in One. The traditional language for the Trinity is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. For many, however, the traditional language is a hindrance to the intimacy of their relationship with God. They note in particular that the tradition incorporates only male language for God, and seek to incorporate other images which point to broader understandings our Triune God. "Giver, Gift, and Holy Spirit"; "Maker, Lover, Keeper"; "Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One God, Mother of All"; are some other Trinitarian images drawn from prayerful, scriptural reflection. Our Scriptures today remind us to remain confident in God's love and to be confident that, for those who seek to live by the truth, we are heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ.

Called Church Conference Today, May 30

Jamie Luckett has been nominated by the Member Resource Committee to serve as a Deacon, filling the unexpired term of Amy Ward-Meier who will be joining Ed in Washington, D.C. Please join the Special Election by Zoom following worship today, May 30th.

Procedure for the Election of a Deacon to Fill an Unexpired Term

- At the close of worship Sunday, May 30th, members of RLBC will access the called church conference via a Zoom meeting. The Zoom ID for the meeting has been sent to members by email.
- Once the church has been called into conference, a link to access a ballot will appear in "Chat."
 - 1. Members will open the ballot, mark the ballot, and submit it to be counted.
 - 2. Ballots must be accessed and submitted by 1:00 PM Sunday afternoon.
- Drive-by balloting will be available for one hour, 12:00 PM 1:00 PM Sunday in the
 parking lot behind the sanctuary.
- Members of the Tabulating Committee will be tasked with counting the ballots and reporting the results to the deacon chair.
- The deacon chair will be responsible for communicating the results of the ballot to the congregation.

Letter from the Deacon Chair

Dear RLBC Family,

Since the middle of March 2020, "doing church" together has been quite the struggle. Despite the challenges, we have managed to reach out to our members in need, celebrate graduates, read and walk together for social justice, welcome babies, say "goodbye" to loved ones, respond to our call for missions work, and to sustain worship and Sunday School. All of this looked different, but by doing all this and more, we have continued to do God's work in our community. And, as a bonus, we have each sharpened our technology skills!

None of us want to continue this style of church, and we are happy to announce that our Deacon Board received and approved a recommendation from our Re-Opening Task Force that Royal Lane return to in-person worship. We want to thank you for being patient and putting your trust in the work of the Task Force. Since the CDC's recent changes, here are the latest updates for Royal Lane as we continue our worship and work together:

- 1. For those fully vaccinated, masks are no longer required when we gather, but are encouraged. In compliance with the recent CDC guidelines, unvaccinated worshippers are encouraged to mask and maintain social distance. We trust that unvaccinated worshippers will continue their commitment to the health and safety of everyone, especially children under the age of 12, who are ineligible for a vaccine and the immunocompromised.
- 2. The sanctuary will have several pews in the back reserved for those who are more comfortable with social distancing.
- 3. We will return to in-person worship for regular 10:55 AM services beginning June 6, 2021. The worship service will be livestreamed for viewing on our YouTube channel.
- 4. Some Wednesday night activities are resuming in Vickrey Hall. Food will not be served. Masks and distancing are encouraged.

I want to thank our Re-Opening Task Force and our Deacon Board for their leadership and commitment to the Royal Lane family of faith. Though we have a lot of work ahead of us, I look forward to welcoming everyone back to worship on the corner of Royal Lane and Hillcrest!!

Doug Watts, Guest Preacher




Graduate Recognition, Sunday, June 6




Guest Preacher, June 13 Ken Medema

For four decades, Ken Medema has inspired people through storytelling and music. Though blind from birth, Ken sees and hears with heart and mind. His ability to capture spirit in word and song is unparalleled.

One of the most creative and authentic artists performing today, Ken custom designs every musical moment of his performance with brilliant improvisation that defies description.

Music early became a major component of Medema's life. "I started banging on the piano when I was five years old," he says, "making up crazy little fantasies on my mom's piano. When I was eight years old my parents got me a



wonderful teacher who taught me the classics with Braille music and taught me to play by ear." His teacher also taught him to improvise. "Every time I learned a piece my teacher would tell me, 'Now, you improvise in that style.' So music became a second language."

After graduating from high school Medema studied music therapy at Michigan State University in Lansing, where he concentrated heavily on performance skills in piano and voice. He worked as a music therapist in Fort Wayne, Indiana, returned to Michigan State for a master's degree (1969).

In 1973, Medema left his work as a therapist and began a career as a performing and recording artist. Today, Medema performs in a wide variety of venues, from local congregations to charity fundraisers, to high school and university campuses, to denominational youth gatherings, to universally televised religious programs, to corporate conventions, to annual assemblies of national organizations. He is co-founder of Interlude Retreat Corporation, which gifts retreat experiences for music directors.

Ken Medema and his wife, Jane, have been married since 1965 and live in the San Francisco Bay area of California. They have two grown married children and four grandchildren, **Aaron** and Sonya Medema (Charlotte and Henry) and **Rachel** and Dennis Gilchrist (Logan James and Fiona Lee).
