The construction of the RLBC Columbarium Garden began Tuesday, September 21....the dirt is flying! The central part of the Columbarium Garden that incudes the Niches and central plantings will be the first stage. Landscaping around the Garden will continue as funds are available. This first stage of construction should be finished in 4 to 6 weeks (depending on weather). Remember preconstruction cost of a Niche is \$3,000.00.
