Scott is the musical director for several local theaters as well as several schools in the Plano area. He holds a degree in Music Theory and Composition from Oklahoma Baptist University and has done graduate work in Jazz Theory and Composition at the University of South Carolina. He has produced four albums and has a number of published

arrangements for choir, keyboard and orchestra.

Mudibu Rita Nsumbu is a Fort Worth native who performs all over the DFW. She is a graduate of Hardin-Simmons University where she competed and won 2 NATS Great Plains competitions. She has previously been seen in musical theatre shows such as *The Sound of Music, Mary Poppins, Aida*,



Phantom, and The Little Mermaid. Rita also wrote and performed lyrics for the song cycle, The 5 Stages of Grief, composed by up-and-coming composer Stephen Ryan Jackson.

The Scripture this morning is John 2:1-11, which may be found on page 863 of the New Testament of the pew Bible or as an insert in your order of worship.

20n the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ²Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." 4And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." 5His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. ⁷Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. 8He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. 9When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom 10 and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the quests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." 11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. (NRSV)
