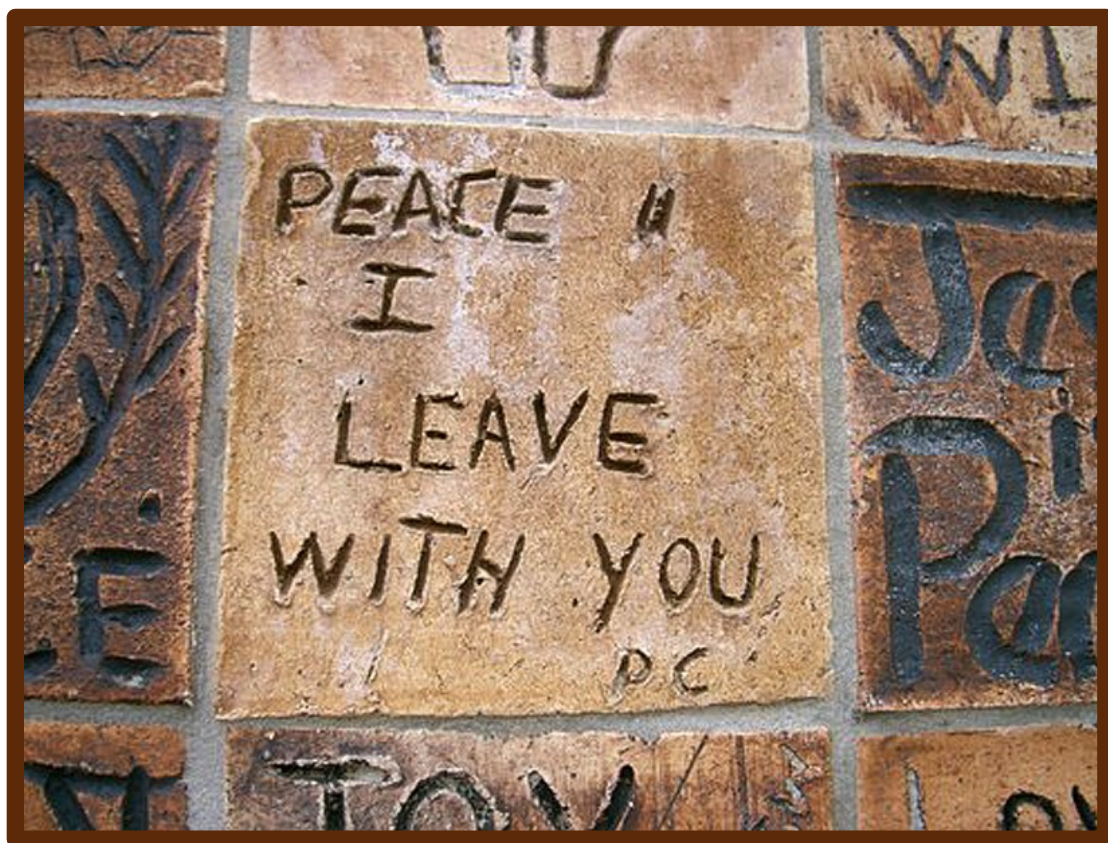

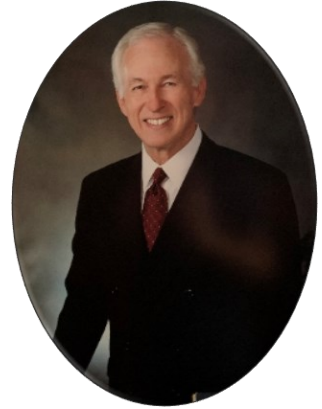

Rebecca, our Royal Lane guest from Shenzhen, China, graduated from Dallas Baptist University with a Master of Arts in Theological Studies.



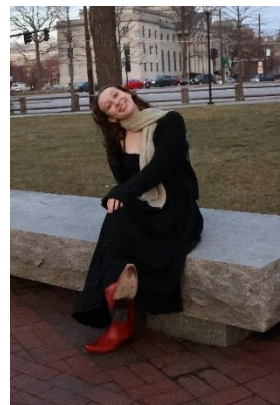
## Jillian Luna


### June 26 – All-Church Farewell
