

He and his wife Charlotte share their life with their 4 children, 5 grandchildren and their dogs Madonna and Clara.



"Paul and Barny: What Do We Do Now?"

For the Wednesday nights of September, our former member Dr. Dean Dickens will be our presenter. Dean and Karr La were Royal Lane members for many years. He currently keeps his membership in the churches where he is doing Intentional Interim ministries. Two years ago, he was recognized as Texas Baptists outstanding Intentional Interim minister.

Dean and Karr La spent 28 years as field missionaries, 15 years teaching preaching (Southwestern and the Philippine Baptist Seminary) and pastoring. The last 12 of those years (while they were at Royal Lane) they supervised field missionaries all around the world. Now retired, each year he still does three or four "Preaching in Culture" workshops usually in developing world countries, focusing on illiterate and semi-literate men and women leading churches.

Dean and Karr La are long-time friends of Royal Lane, and we are looking forward to having them join us for fellowship! Dean will begin these Wednesday nights talking with us about the normal traumas churches face in transition times: "Paul and Barny: What Do We Do Now?"
