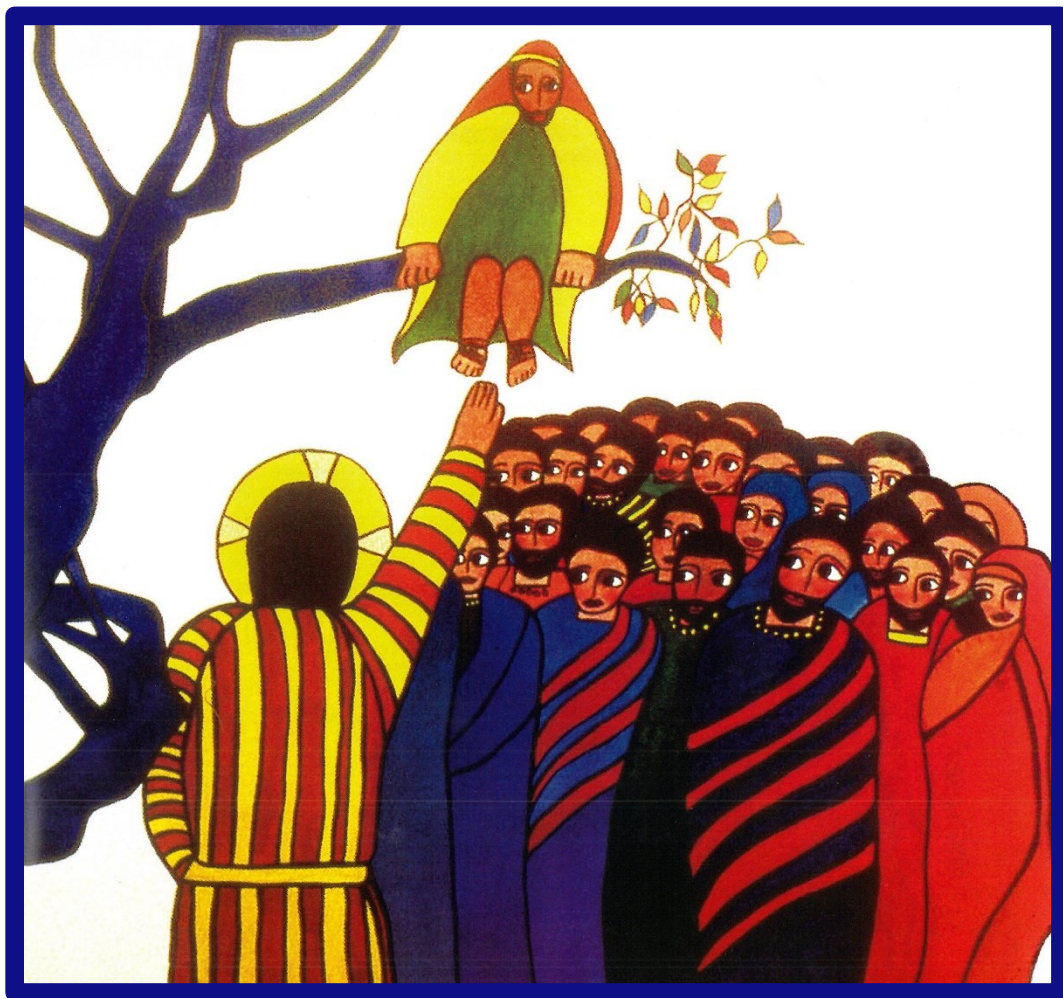

### Chiming of the Hour

*In Christian memory and tradition Zacchaeus is portrayed as either fraudulent or as a collaborator with the occupying Roman government.... The reaction of the crowd bears this out. They all ‘murmured’ that Jesus had gone to be the guest of a ‘sinner.’ Zacchaeus, meanwhile, has responded to Jesus’ visit by giving half of his goods to the poor. Then comes the hidden sting in the story, for he adds that if had defrauded anyone of anything he will restore it fourfold. If. That ‘if’ must be one of the most important two-letter words in the Gospels. That Zacchaeus is despised by the crowd is not in doubt. But nowhere in the story does it say that he was dishonest. He is simply hated for what he does, but he almost certainly acts with honesty and integrity.*

## Victoria Robb Powers, Guest Preacher



Rev. Robb Powers was born in Midland and raised in Lubbock. She graduated from Baylor University in 2009, majoring in religion and philosophy. She received her Master of Divinity degree from Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University (2012). While there, she received the student preaching award and Baptist studies award.

In 2013, she completed four units of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) and then worked as a hospital chaplain at Baylor University Medical Center. In 2014, she directed an ESL program, Northwest Arlington ESL, in Arlington, Texas. Also in 2014, she was ordained to the gospel ministry by Wilshire Baptist Church.

Rev. Robb Powers began working in parish ministry in 2015 at Highland Park United Methodist Church (Dallas) where she was recognized as an elder by extension. While at HPUMC, she pastored the Cox Chapel service – a service of liturgy and sacrament. She also served as Director of Adult Ministry and oversaw all adult-age level ministries within the church.


In 2019, she began serving as executive pastor at University Park United Methodist Church (Dallas). She currently serves as board chair of the Baptist House of Studies at SMU Perkins School of Theology, directed by Dr. Jaime Clark-Soles. Rev. Powers, also currently serves on the board for Fellowship Southwest, directed by Stephen Reeves.

She has been married to Matt Powers since 2010. Matt is a financial planner at Frontier Investment Management. They have three children: Benjamin (7), Ruthie (5), Hannah (18 months). They live in Lake Highlands, where Benjamin attends White Rock Elementary, and the girls are in preschool at Highland Park UMC. They have a golden retriever named Winston (he's 9).



She loves to preach, read, write, and have meaningful conversations about faith. She enjoys traveling and eating. She's running her first half marathon in December (Dallas Marathon).




# Zacchaeus Was a Tax Man





## Garrett Vickrey, Guest Preacher, November 6

Garrett Vickrey is Senior Pastor at Woodland Baptist Church, San Antonio, Texas. He’s a graduate of Baylor University and the Wake Forest University School of Divinity. Garrett was born and raised in Dallas, Texas where his father was the pastor of Royal Lane Baptist Church for 26 years. Before coming to Woodland, Garrett served as a Pastoral Resident at Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas and as the Minister of Youth at Myers Park Baptist Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. He and his wife, Cameron Mason Vickrey, have three daughters in elementary school.

He serves on the board of visitors for the Wake Forest University School of Divinity, the board of the Baptist House of Studies at Perkins School of Theology, the board of Texas Baptist Women in Ministry, the board of BCFS Health & Human Services, and he is the moderator of CBF Texas.



## Gerry Wood, Guest Musician

Praised for his “polished tone and amazing expressivity” by the Dallas Morning News, Gerald “Gerry” Wood joined the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra as Principal Horn in 2022. Prior to his appointment, he held positions in the Dallas Opera Orchestra and the Dallas Winds and was a prolific freelancer in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. From drum and bugle corps to chamber ensembles to video game recording sessions to orchestras worldwide (including China, Korea, Germany, Poland, Italy, and Switzerland), Mr. Wood's playing experience runs the gamut of performance ensembles. He has performed as a soloist at the Busan Maru International Music Festival in Korea and is the founding member of the internationally renowned Horn quartet, The Four Hornsmen of the Apocalypse.



A well-respected educator and clinician, Mr. Wood is the Adjunct Assistant Professor of Horn at the University of Texas Arlington and the founder and director of The UTA Honors Horn Camp and the Bluebonnet Horn Festival. Both of which are dedicated to the education and inspiration of young horn players. For over a decade, he was the Horn instructor at the Oklahoma Summer Arts Institute and has presented numerous clinics and performances at workshops and universities around the country, including twice at the Texas Music Educators Association Convention in San Antonio, Texas. In addition, he has several articles published in the New Groves Dictionary of Music and Musicians.

A native of the Dallas/Fort Worth area, he holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education (Stephen F. Austin State University), a Masters in Horn Performance (University of Southern Mississippi), and is currently working on his Doctorate of Musical Arts in Horn Performance and Instrumental Conducting (University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana).

Gerry and his wife, Molly, reside in Colleyville with two of their three children. He is proud that his entire family, including Molly, are successful horn players and musicians. Gerry hasn't had hair on his head since he was twenty or so, and don't worry, his kids don't find him funny either!
